It is our aim to uphold the WORD OF GOD and honor it. We purpose to teach the TRUTH which will help prevent false doctrine or perversion from the TRUTH. It is no small task set before us, but by God's grace and help we can and will do just that. WHAT WE BELIEVE

VICTORY BAPTIST BIBLE COLLEGE was established in 1987 by our college president, Dr. Samuel E. Hyde, Sr., and then Dean, Mr. Earl Hodges, in Hampton, Virginia, its' present home. The college and Seminary is a local church ministry under the auspices of Victory Baptist Church along with the Victory Baptist School.

OUR PRESIDENT

DR. SAMUEL ELMER HYDE, SR. graduated from Clear Creek Baptist College, Pineville, Kentucky in May 1963. During his time in college he was pastor of Riverview Baptist Church in Calvin, Kentucky.

He returned to Hampton, Virginia (where he lived prior to college) and started Victory Baptist Church, with his and three other families, in October 1963. He worked as a construction superintendent for two years until the church was large enough to support him full time. His wife, Shirley, has played a vital role in all of the ministries up to this point and those that have followed over the years.

The Central Baptist College of Hampton, Virginia extended an invitation to Pastor Hyde to teach in their institution. Which he did from September 1966 until January 1986.

Victory Baptist Children's Home was founded in 1978 as a church ministry with Pastor Hyde as its director for the next eleven years. With the children's home there was a need for a school. The children attended Central Baptist School for two years and in 1980 Victory Baptist School was started. Since additional training was required, Pastor Hyde attended school in Lewisville, Texas. After completing this, he has served as principal until the present.

Other studies include twenty-five hours of study in constitutional law at Bob Jones University, Greenville, South Carolina. Study and preparation has a definite goal in Pastor Hyde's life. Since 1981 he has attended two annual seminars in order to improve his abilities to serve the Lord. He continues to attend seminars.

With the expertise of Earl F. Hodges, Pastor Hyde led the Victory Baptist Church in establishing Victory Baptist Bible College. He has served as its president since its' founding in 1987.

In May 1994 Tabernacle Baptist College and Theological Seminary, Virginia Beach, Virginia conferred a doctor of divinity degree upon him.

The Virginia Assembly of Independent Baptist elected Pastor Hyde to serve a three-year term on the board of directors. This assembly includes five hundred churches across Virginia.

Dr. Hyde, a native of Bryson City, North Carolina and a veteran of the Korean War, is a frequent speaker in alumni meetings, revival meetings, and pastor's fellowship meetings.

OUR DEAN OF STUDENTS

DR. ROBERT W. WILSON came to be with us at the beginning of the College. Taking courses under Brother Hodges and Pastor Hyde, he eventually became an instructor in the College.

As of August of 2010, Brother Wilson became the Dean of Students, following the home going of Dr. Wayne Giles, who was Dean for many years.

Brother Wilson is from Marietta, Georgia. He served in the U.S. Navy aboard USS Enterprise CVAN 65. After which he married Miss June Evans of Newport News, whose father, Rev. Charles Evans, was pastor of New Testament Baptist Church of Hampton, Va.

Graduating from Tennessee Temple University, Brother Wilson ministered as an associate pastor and then Pastor of Harvest Baptist Church in Newport News. The Wilsons reside in Newport News, and have four children and six grandchildren.

WELCOME TO VICTORY BAPTIST BIBLE COLLEGE

ORIENTATION - On orientation night you will receive a registration form to be filled out and turn in on your first night of class. We prefer that you come by or request in writing a copy of the registration form prior to the beginning of school and submit the \$30.00 registration fee. **In any case registration fee MUST BE paid before you can take a class.** There is an additional cost for books (s). Any exceptions will be cleared through the dean of students.

CLASSES - Classes begin at 6:30 PM. Student is required to arrive on time. If for any reason you will be late you must notify the college. For a three-hour class, there will be

two 15-minute breaks; and for a two-hour class, there will be one 15-minute break. Each teacher can elect not to take a break and complete class in an early fashion.

CHAPEL SERVICES - Chapel services will be held each month. The speaker and date for chapel will be (in most cases) posted in the Dean's office.

REVIVALS - Revival services are considered a part of your semester requirement. You must attend the night (s) of your class. Each student is to make an outline of the revival message and turn it into the Dean of Students. This requirement will be a part of your learning experience.

BANQUET AND GRADUATION - At the end of the school year there is a college banquet. Each student is expected to attend.

DRESS CODE - Men are required to wear a tie and casual dress shirt and pants. Ladies are required to wear a dress or skirt and blouse. The dress or skirt must be below the knees and no low necklines. The dress may not have a split extending more than half way from the ankle to the knee.

SPECIAL OFFERINGS - Our teachers are not paid - they willingly give their time for you and the Lord. There will be a special offering each semester and each student is expected to participate. These offerings are used one hundred percent for the teachers love offering at the end of each semester. We are told in Scripture that the workman is worthy of his hire. Checks can be made out to Victory Baptist Bible College and can be claimed on your tax return. At the beginning of the year you will receive a record of all you have given to the college.

ADMISSION POLICY

We are a non-discriminatory college and seminary. We do not use discriminatory practices in regard to race, national origin, or gender. Dear Students and Prospective Students:

At the beginning of a new school year you need to decide the courses you will take based on those being offered. Registration for the first semester of the school year will be the last Monday in August at 6:00 p.m. If that is not a good time for those desiring to enroll, please call the college anytime before classes begin.

Classes will also begin on the last Monday in August at 6:30 p.m. All students will need to have completed registration and enrollment prior to starting class.

Registration and Tuition will be \$30.00 Registration and \$60.00 Tuition per student, per semester. We have intentionally kept the cost at a low level to help those who otherwise could not afford college. If you cannot pay the required tuition and registration fees due to financial stress, and can show evidence of the same, then we will review your situation on a case-by-case basis and may waive this requirement. Book fees are the responsibility of the student. For those who will be graduating at the end of the school year, there is a \$25.00 diploma fee and a \$25.00 graduation fee with no exceptions. The transcript is \$10.00.

Because tuition and registration is at a low cost and the college teachers teach without pay, every student is asked to give a gift to the college for the teachers prior to the Christmas holidays and prior to the end of the second semester. REFUND OF TUITION: If you cancel or drop out of the course you may receive a full refund, provided you submit a written notice of cancellation to the Dean of Students, not later than the second week of September of the first semester; or the first week of February of the second semester. Students are required to document their Christian Service. The documentation should include ordination certificate and any other documentation that will affirm the place and time of service in the Lord's work as pastor, missionary or other full time worker. You must submit a resume of ministry and service. A fee of \$30.00 is required for these credits.

If you desire evaluation of your life experiences in the ministry, you must submit a letter to the college requesting an evaluation of such experience.

TRANSFER CREDITS: This College will accept transfer credits from creditable colleges where you've attended and completed work. Transcripts must be sent from the college you attended to VICTORY BAPTIST BIBLE COLLEGE Attn: Dean of Students. In all cases you must complete 32 credit hours with VBBC.

BIBLE COURSES

BS4022 Daniel & Revelation

Daniel's prophecy in light of the prophecy of Revelation will reveal the reason for the Great Tribulation – to make an end of sin in fulfillment of the return of the worthy Lamb of God as King of kings. After the Messiah is cut off at the 69th week, we see the body of Christ, (The Church), is in view until the 70th week when an end of sin is made.

BS4023 Biblical Studies in Matthew

This course looks at the presentation of the Messiah as King. The Royal Genealogy of the Messiah is presented from Abraham to the inception of the Holy Promised One. To those who believed that Abraham was the father of the Jews; Jesus was the promised redemption of the Jews (Matthew 1:21). The Student will see a progressive rejection of the King, and the King rejecting the Nation; yet, the passion of the King's suffering is evident of God's love for us all

BS3023 Exegesis of Galatians

Exegesis is the interpretation and explanation of the language and thought of the Bible —a minute study of the Word of God verse by verse.

BS3023 General Epistles

The student will study the non-Pauline Epistles written to the first century disciples. Here we examine the theological and practical value of these epistles for modern man.

RS3022 Prophecy I, II

An extensive study of the various phases of prophetic scripture. This includes a critical analysis of the doctrine of the Second Coming of Christ.

BS2023 Letters of John the Apostle

An analysis of the letters of John the Beloved Disciple: Gospel of John, I, II, III John.

BS2023 Pentateuch I, II

This study views the genealogies and lifespan of Genesis; The settlement of the Sons of Noah; Abram's migration: From Jacob's exploits to the chosen line of Israel; Israel's bondage to their Exodus; Moses as a deliverer under God's direction; The wilderness tabernacle and God's commands for the nation; Israel's wonderings. The student will receive a greater appreciation of the magnitude of God's intervention and directions of His servants.

BS2013 Letters of Paul

Paul spoke for the Lord and instructed the churches in discipleship. The letters supply modern day believers in the practical value of daily living for the Lord. This course will give teeth to the ministry of the student.

RS1023 General New Testament Survey

A bird's eye view of each book of the New Testament. A general one semester overall view of the whole New Testament.

RS1013 General Old Testament Survey

Here we will look at an general overall survey of the Old Testament to get the larger picture. This course views what the various books are about such as writer, purpose, and a survey of what the book is teaching. The big picture is in view here and will help the student get an overall focus on the many parts.

BS1013 Bible Doctrine I, II

The student will learn from the Bible the teachings about God, Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit, man, and salvation. These studies will enhance the ability of the student to better understand how one fits into God's purpose.

EDU2012 Bible Study Methods

This course is important to every student in that it guides one through a verse-by-verse analysis method of Bible study, as-well-as analytical method of study, a synthetic method of study, a topical method, and a biographical method. It gives each student the ability to improve the skills they may already have. How to interpret the Bible and principles of application.

THE2013 Systematic Theology I, II, III, IV

Here the student will examine Systematic Theology in its involvement of collecting and understanding all the relevant passages in the Bible on various topics and then summarizing their teachings clearly so that the student will know what to believe about each topic.

BS3012 Bible Study Principles

This subject is also known as "Hermeneutics." The student will be enhanced by this study in the principles of Bible interpretation. We look at narrative, wisdom, prophetic, figures of speech, types, dispensationalism and the covenants to name a few.

ADDITIONAL COURSES OFFERED IN BIBLICAL STUDIES

Various books of the Bible – The student will go through a chapter-by- chapter and verse-by-verse study of the book being offered. This study will give confidence to students in preparation and knowing God's Word better.

APPLIED CHRISTIANITY COURSES

PC4071 Practical Christianity

The "Practical Christianity" is given for the work each student documents in his or her own churches – such as preaching, teaching, soul winning, visitation and bus ministry. It is cumulative over the period of the college experience and is discretionary.

RS4022 Church Polity I, II

Continuing: Here are the perspectives on Church Government. The development on the biblical perspective on church government is highly important for anyone seeking to minister effectively in the context of a local congregation. This course is a view of the organization of the church and how governed.

RS4013 Pastoral Counseling

Many Christian schools teaching counseling use the world's professional techniques and psychology to teach and apply counseling. We teach from the Word of God. The Word of God addresses every conceivable malady, or psychological disorder known to man. The best practitioner of counseling is one who masters the Holy Scripture.

MUS3022 Fundamentals of Music

Here the student is introduced to the music notation, the different groups of musical instruments, hymnology, congregational and choir song leading, and the planning of a good church musical program.

THE3013 Pastoral Theology I, II

The science of the care of souls. Pastoral Theology is the essentials of Ministry. It provides for the construction of sound theological principles for guidance and critique of pastoral practice. This study will enhance the student's ability to the care for the flock.

RS1011 Orientation

A class required of all first-year students which emphasizes various aspect of a Victory Bible Student.

RS2022 World Religions

This is a basic survey of the various world religions, and how they have progressed from the past, to the present, and what their future might look like. The semester ends with a look at the New Age movement.

HIS2022 Baptist Church History

What we know about the History of Baptist is mostly written by those who persecuted them and tried to do away with them. Here the student will learn the Baptist stayed faithful to the principles of the early church from Jerusalem. They were called by many names down through the centuries and were faithful in standing on the Baptist Principles for which we stand today

RS2012 Homiletics I, II

This is the science that treats of the analysis, classification, preparation, composition, and delivery of sermons. The student will receive practical application, preparing, and delivery.

RS2013 Modern Cults & New Age

Here we examine the various religious cults and what they all have in common. We need to understand how these cults feed on the lack of knowledge. Knowing the Word of God is the first line of defense.

RS1023 Personal Evangelism

Methods and practical application of personal evangelism is applied. The student is expected to excel in Scripture memorization that applies to the gospel of Christ and soul winning. Active participation is required and weekly reports are to be turned in on evangelism out reach.

RS Biblical Research I, II

A course setting forth principle of Bible study with bible themes or subjects being assigned each semester for completion. Much research is required enabling the student to familiarize himself with commentaries and reference books. A class is usually not held by instructor, with the exception of first couple of classes to assign the work and then only at instructors discretion.

BS1023 Life of Christ I, II

The student will learn about the teachings of Christ. From His baptism to His coronation, to His trial, to His crucifixion, to His resurrection, and then His last words to His disciples before His ascension.

RS1022 Biblical Missions

This course looks at the first missionaries from Jerusalem to the uttermost parts of the world. We will learn that missions are God's mandate. Find out who were some of the early missionaries in America and how God used them in our early History.

EDU1013 English Composition I, II

The Student will learn sentence completeness, the parts of speech, the mechanics of composition that are necessary for mastery of the functional grammar and usage of English. The student will be tested in their proficiency in each area of comprehension.

THE1012 Proper Prayer Life

Individual prayer is of the utmost importance to the believer. Here we define prayer. We will see prayer in action; and we will learn to pray. Prayer involves our relationship to God and our relationship to each other. Prayer is not arguing with God; it is an expression of faith with God. Along with this subject, *Christian Ethics* will also be included in the semester. Christian ethics is an assessment of morals and what is morally right and what is wrong. Since Christians base their beliefs on God's revelations in Scripture, the Bible will be cited as an authority for conclusions drawn here.

EDU4013 Hebrew I, II

A course in the study of the Hebrew language, the language of the Old Testament. (If Instructor available)

EDU4013 Greek I, II

A course in the study of the Koine Greek, the language of the New Testament.

VICTORY BAPTIST BIBLE COLLEGE EXTENSION PROGRAM

For those students who cannot attend classes at the college, VBBC offers an Extension Program. The student enrolls the same as those attending classes with fees and application.

The college will determine the course of study the student has chosen and will mail the student all the material for that course. Some fees will apply such as books and material if needed.

The required work should be finished in the amount of time allotted by the College and returns the work by mail. It will be graded by an instructor and proper credit will be given accordingly. The required work sent becomes the property of the College, so the student should keep a copy of all that is sent.

All fees must be paid before the College can send the degree to the student.
